The 50m warm up pool will be available for the morning Heats and throughout the Finals in the evening. If heats occur when the 50m training pool is not available, the 25m Diving Pit will open as a swim down facility.

FRIDAY 24 MAY

- Training**

We have an allocation of 6 lanes available in the competition pool for training on Friday 26 May. These will be mainly reserved for international athletes that have travelled and British World Class athletes & programmes. If athletes wish to use the pool time, please contact events@aprace.club with your desired training time and this will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis. For domestic athletes, please follow the same process but note internationals will maintain priority.

Time slots are 45 minute sessions:

17:00-17:45, 17:45-18:30, 18:30-19:15, 19:15-20:00

The AP Race team will be flexible in allowing as many requirements wherever possible.

- Accreditation Collection**

This will be available at the Main Reception of the London Aquatics Centre on Friday 24 May from 4.30pm and into the Team Leader meeting. We encourage as many athletes as possible to collect their accreditation at this time to ease congestion on Saturday 25 May.

- Team Leader Meeting**

The Team Leader Meeting will take place at London Aquatics Centre at **6pm**. A representative of each club/team/athlete are urged to be present. The Event Director will run through all the processes of the competition and any amendments to the running of the meet will be made clear at this meeting. We will also ensure this is available online for those unable to make it in person. Details will be shared closer to the time.

WITHDRAWALS

These must be made online via the swimming.events website (the same place entries were submitted). The Team Leader meeting is the deadline for all withdrawals for Day 1 of competition.



ACCREDITATION

If you cannot collect your accreditation on Friday 24th May, then this will be available at the Athlete Entrance Door at the time you arrive. Please note that you may need to queue, so collection is advisable as early as possible when the doors open (see timings section). **Accreditation must be worn by athletes at all times in the venue.** Security will be located throughout the venue at checkpoints and accreditation must be displayed to access each area. If you lose your accreditation, you must visit the Sport Information Desk where a new one can be purchased for £5.

Athlete accreditation will allow access to any session – even if the athlete is not racing. The allocated athlete seating area must be used. **Athletes will not be allowed to sit in the spectator area but can visit family.**

A member of the AP Team will contact each applicant to confirm their Swim England / AquaticsGB membership number and/or Team Manager information. Coaches / Team Managers from international federations must provide the equivalent documentation or evidence of qualification.

We know some athletes have entered on their own without a dedicated coach. Whilst we of course encourage individual swimmers to have a Coach / Team Manager alongside them, the logistics of the competition allow for sufficient safeguarding of the swimmers who may not be part of a team. This area is managed by security and has access to AP Race Team at the Sport Info Desk to provide any information required.

Athlete seating is located upstairs in the athlete section of the balcony, but their accreditation allows them into the spectator area so there is no limit to how long you can spend with your child/swimmer. Please note that seats are ticketed so you will not be able to bring your swimmer into the spectator seats unless they have a ticket - but there will be spare seats mainly across the diving pit should you wish to sit with your child for a certain time.

SPORT INFORMATION

This desk is located in the Athlete Seating area on the upper concourse. This desk is used for all queries, withdrawals, disputes, athlete accreditation or just general information should it be required. We are here to help so please visit the desk should you need any assistance.

ANTI-DOPING

A reminder, particularly for international level athletes, that should anti-doping present themselves on site, athletes are subject to doping control tests conducted by an official body. **Athletes selected for anti-doping must provide an official photo ID to confirm their identity as per World Aquatics and World Anti-Doping requirements.**

BELONGINGS

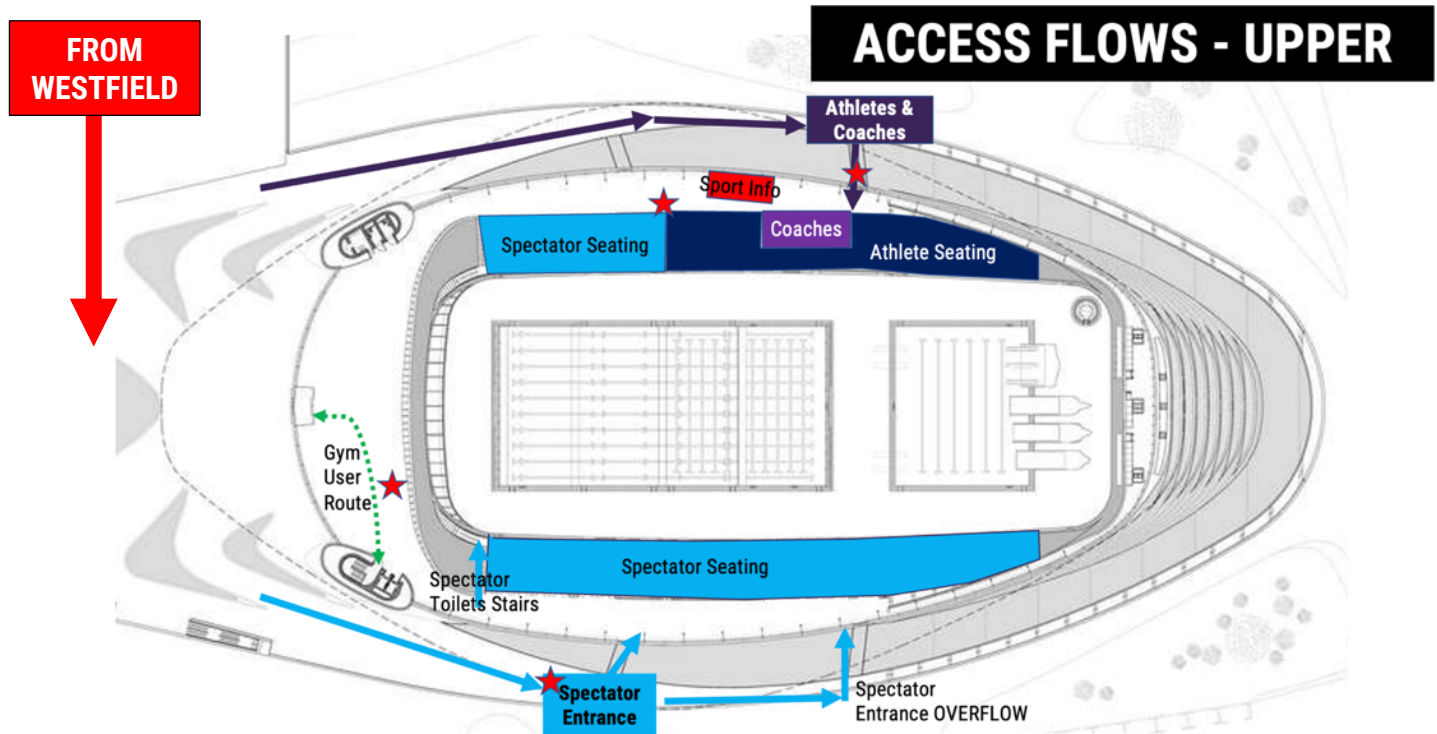
Secure lockers are available for athletes in the Changing Village. A returnable £1 coin or token from reception can be used.

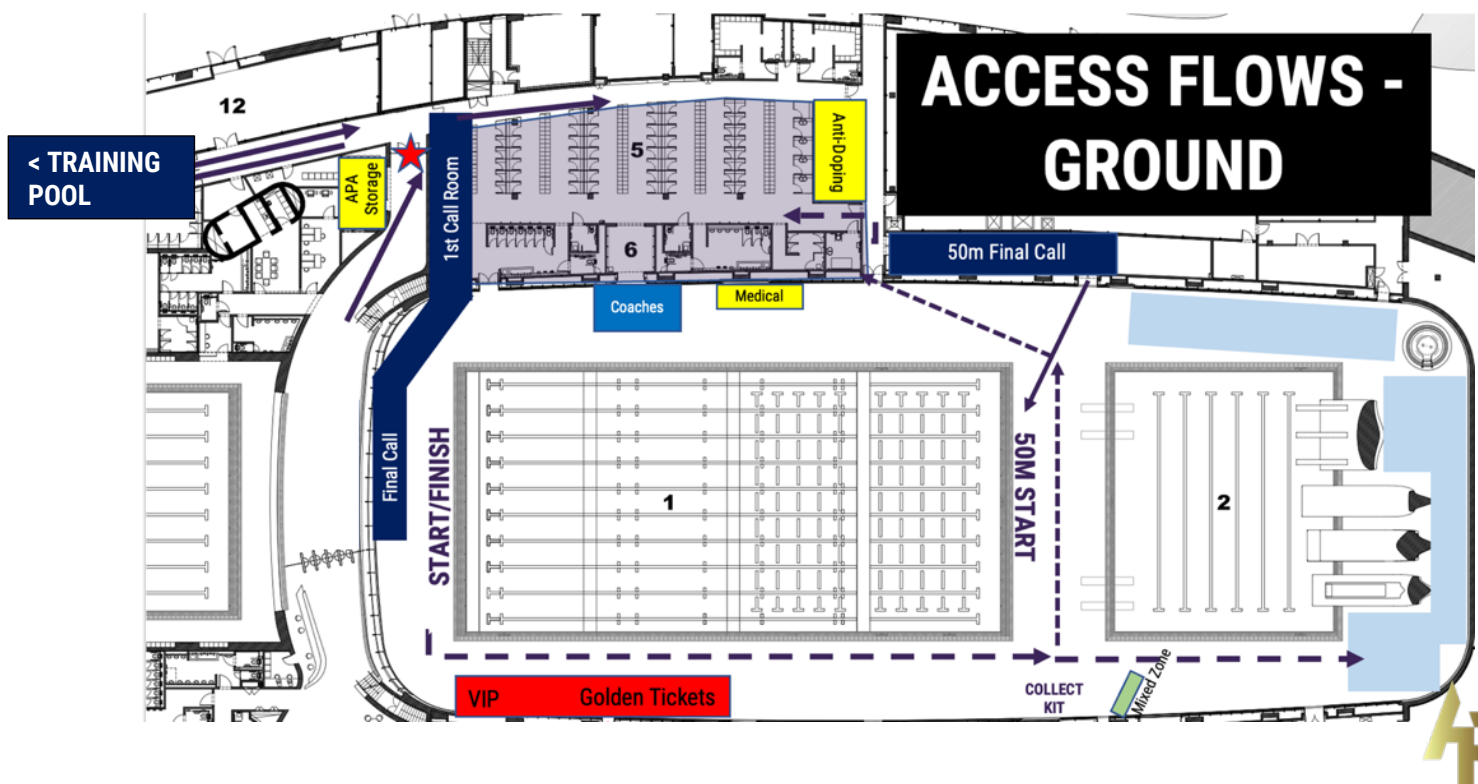
VENUE ACCESS ROUTES – UPPER

- **Athletes & Coaches** must enter through the upper side doors, which leads straight into the athlete seating area. No entry will be allowed through the venue's main entrance.
- **Spectators** enter on the opposite side through the upper doors immediately into spectator seating



ATHLETE AREAS

- The main athlete seating is shown on the diagram above within the stands
- Areas shown in light blue below (around the diving pit) is reserved for athletes on international teams (or GBR programmes) who wish to use more space for massage beds and land warm up. Access to this space is only via the Changing Village
- The Changing Village, Training Pool and Call Rooms are all accessible via the staircase from the upper concourse
- If they wish, Coaches can choose to watch the racing from pool deck in the designated area

Tickets are selling very fast and there are only a limited number of seats for some of the session blocks. Some sections have already sold out.

Reminder that B, Junior and Super Finals are all covered within one Finals ticket.

AP RACE AVENUE

Situated upstairs on the upper concourse, the AP Avenue will house stalls with merchandise, programmes, competition entries and offerings from our event partners. We encourage all our spectators to visit the AP Avenue!

SAFEGUARDING

We remain committed to protecting all our athletes in the following key ways:

- Coaches and Team Managers must disclose their approved Swim England (or other relevant body) details to the Event Team when emailed to do so otherwise accreditation will be revoked
- Photography and videos of individuals must not be taken by general spectators when attending the competition. Only official Photographers are permitted.
- Athletes will be allowed to enter the spectator area to speak with parents/guardians (**but it will not be allowable for athletes to sit in the spectator section**).
- A Sport Information Desk will be in the athlete section (upper concourse) to assist any athletes. Volunteers will be accompanied by a member of the AP Race staff who are well versed in athlete management and will be able to escalate any queries or concerns to the Event Leadership Team.
- Should there be any specific requests prior to the event, please email us at events@aprace.club

MEDICAL

The Event Organisers have arranged for a paramedic to be present should there be any athlete emergencies. This is in addition to the London Aquatics Centre lifeguards who will conduct any water-based rescues and maintain the lead on medical emergencies in the building. There will also be two dedicated First Aiders for spectators should it be required – please contact a member of the team, an official or a steward if you require medical assistance.

Anti-doping teams may be present and if so, a specific area has been identified within the Changing Village for anti-doping teams to operate from. **It is imperative that athletes tagged for anti-doping testing have an official form of identification as per international anti-doping rules.**

For the information of international visitors:

- In the case of emergency when not on site, please dial 999
- In the case of non-emergency please dial 111 (or consult Event Medical Teams)
- The nearest A&E department is Homerton University Hospital, Homerton Row, London E9 6SR (10-15 min drive from London Aquatics Centre)



NATIONAL / INTERNATIONAL ARRIVALS

In London, public transport is by far the quickest, easiest and cheapest form of travel to get around the city. All London Underground, overground trains and buses operate on a contactless basis and you can use Apple Pay or other contactless devices to tap in and out on every form of transport. See below an overview of how to get from the main London transport hubs to Stratford.

FROM LONDON HEATHROW

Option 1 (from T2/3 – you can get from any terminal to these if you wish)

- **Elizabeth Line** directly to **Stratford** (approx 45 mins / £13)
- Very well signposted from all Terminals and airport staff can help to guide you

Option 2 (all terminals)

- LONDON UNDERGROUND: **Piccadilly Line** Heathrow to Holborn
- LONDON UNDERGROUND: At Holborn, change to **Circle Line** eastbound to **Stratford**
- Total approx 1h20 / £5

FROM LONDON GATWICK

Depending on time of landing:

Option 1

- Train (Thameslink) from Gatwick Station to London Bridge (28 mins, costs differ)
- Then get **Jubilee Line** from London Bridge to Stratford (approx 18 mins / £3)

Option 2

- Train (Gatwick Express or Southern) to London Victoria (30 mins, costs differ)
- LONDON UNDERGROUND: **Victoria Line** northbound 2 stops to Oxford Circus
- LONDON UNDERGROUND: At Oxford Circus, change to **Circle Line** eastbound to Stratford

FROM LONDON STANSTED

- *Trains every 30 mins*
- Train (Greater Anglia) London Stansted to Tottenham Hale (38 mins)
- Train (Greater Anglia) change at Tottenham Hale to Stratford (10 mins)

FROM LONDON CITY AIRPORT

- **DLR** (Docklands Light Railway) to Canning Town (6 mins)
- LONDON UNDERGROUND: **Jubilee Line** from Canning Town to Stratford (5 mins)

FROM LONDON EUSTON TRAIN STATION

- LONDON UNDERGROUND: **Northern Line** southbound to Tottenham Court Road (3 mins)
- Then get **Central Line** from Tottenham Court Road to Stratford (approx 14 mins / £2-3)

FROM LONDON ST PANCRAS (EUROSTAR)

- Same instructions as Euston
- Or, every 30-60 mins there is a 7 minute direct train from St Pancras to Stratford

- National Rail services & bus station to local areas

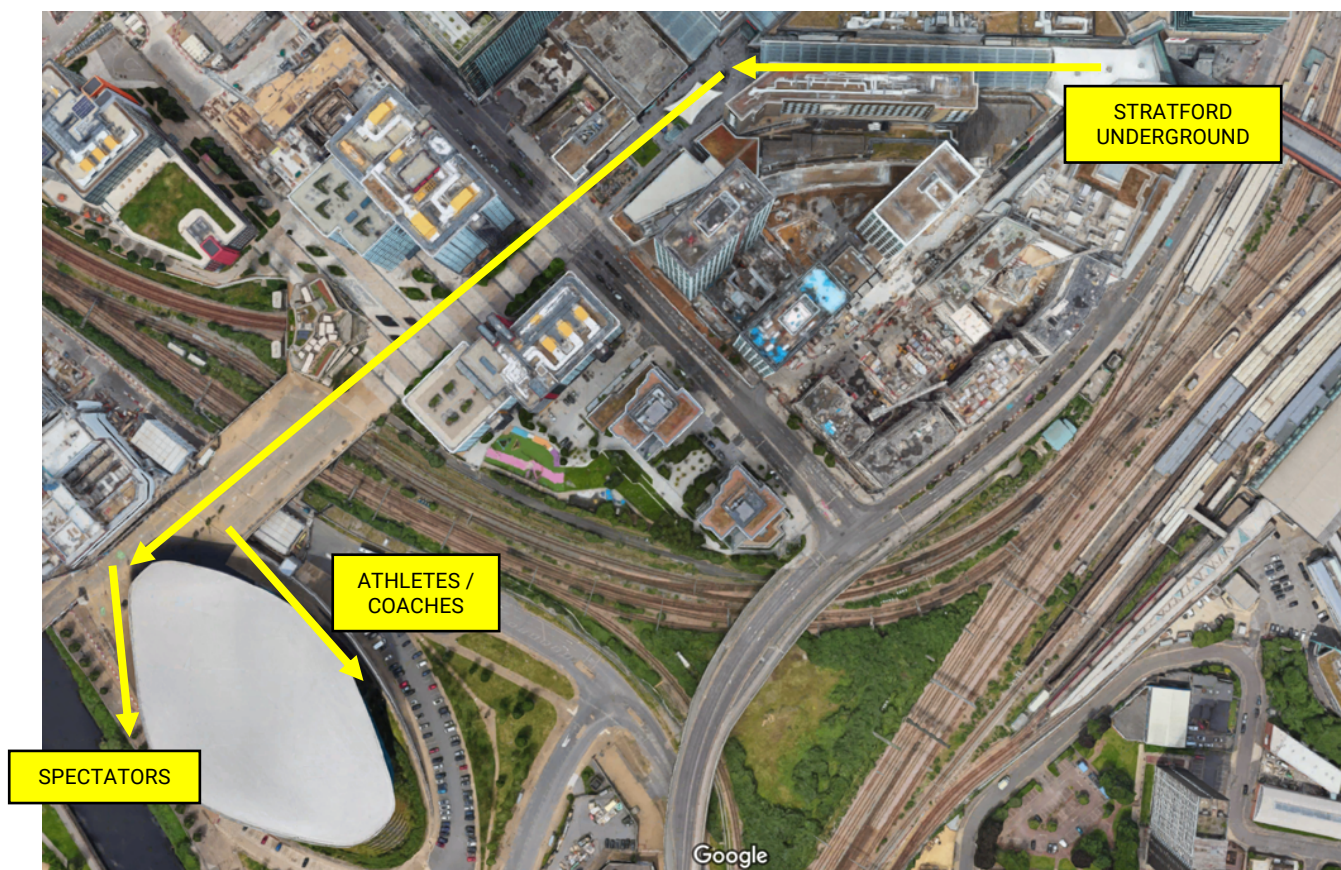
Stratford International Station

EVENT CONDITIONS

1. General Conditions

a) AP Race Events Ltd and its appointed officials reserve full powers over the AP Race London International 2024 including but not limited to cancelling, postponing or changing the venue and/or format due to reasons beyond its reasonable control.

b) The event conditions may be revised in response to Government and Public Health England guidelines related to COVID-19 and sporting competitions, and any other operational limitations. In addition to a change in conditions, limits may need to be placed on entry numbers which could result in some swimmers achieving a qualifying time not being admitted to the meet. In the event of entries being limited and some entries being subsequently declined, entry fees will be refunded in full.

c) The Competition shall be held under World Aquatics Rules and any additional conditions (printed in the respective Meet Information).

d) Entries can be accepted from competitors registered as members of Swim England, Scottish Swimming, or Swim Wales since 25th May 2023 or competitors who are a member of a club within a Federation that is affiliated to World Aquatics. Swimmers may also compete under their Federation name. Where required to do so, competitors shall present their passport for age verification by the end of the Team Leader Meeting on the day before the competition begins.

e) A competitor must be a registered member, or equivalent, of the club in whose name he/she is entered, at the date of entry. For clubs in England, Scotland and Wales, this club must be offered by the online entry system.

f) Junior competitors.

a. Junior Age Groups defined by World Aquatics in relation to AQUA World Junior Championships (WJC);

i. competitors born 2006, 2007, 2008 or 2009

g) Finals - All eligible competitors for the Super Final, B-Final and Junior Final will be seeded into these respective finals (see section 4).

2. The Events

Individual events:

I. 50m, 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle

II. 50m, 100m, 200m Backstroke, Breaststroke, Butterfly

III. 200m, 400m Individual Medley

3. Entries

a) Entries will be via an online entry system. All competitors will be required to complete the online entry documentation in full and pay the required fee in order for their entry to be processed. Full instructions will be included in the Entry Pack.

b) Entries shall open on 1st March 2024 and close at 23:59 on 30th April 2024. Accepted entries will be published on 1st May 2024. Entries may be made after this date if there is space in the programme and at the discretion of the Event Director.

c) Only times achieved in a 50m pool are accepted for entry, no converted times will be accepted.

d) Entry times for all individual events from Swim England, Scottish Swimming and Swim Wales entrants must be recorded in the British Swimming Rankings from swimming competitions designated or licensed for entry into national competitions since 25th May 2023.

e) Split Times of a relay race are not acceptable for entry. The only exception is the first leg of relay, if the time is recorded on the British Rankings or recognised as an individual time by an athlete's federation.

f) A competitor may only compete in the name of one club or federation at the competition.

g) Entries will be capped at a pre-determined number per event to ensure the meet runs to time. Within these entries, a minimum number of spaces will be guaranteed for the Junior age group to protect and preserve Junior racing. The summary of these conditions is as the following:

- 50m events = Fastest 120 entries accepted – minimum 30 junior entries
- 100m = Fastest 110 entries accepted – minimum 30 junior entries
- 200m = Fastest 90 entries accepted – minimum 25 junior entries
- 400m = Fastest 50 entries accepted – minimum 15 junior entries
- 800m = Fastest 40 entries accepted – minimum 10 junior entries
- 1500m = Fastest 20 entries accepted – minimum 5 junior entries

i) Para-swimming entries will be accepted and all classes of swimmers will swim together in inclusive events and not separate events. Para entries will be subject to the same criteria of entry and rejections as able-bodied athletes.

j) Refunds will not be given for swimmers withdrawing from the meet after the closing date or for entry errors or omissions attributable to the individual of their club. Withdrawals for medical reasons must be accompanied by appropriate certification to qualify for a refund to be determined by the Event Director.

k) Entries and results will be managed via computer and available via the internet. By submitting entries, consent is thereby given, to the holding of personal information on a computer. Personal data, including submitted and recorded times will be available during the meet.

l) Competition Management reserve the right to accept entries after the closing date on a first-come-first-served basis should there be spaces in events (numbers detailed in 3g).

4. Meet Procedure

a) All events shall have Heats and Finals except for the 800m freestyle and 1500m freestyle which will be heat declared winner.

b) Heats – should entries exceed that of a single session, there will be two heats sessions (a morning session and an afternoon session).

a. The fastest 4 heats of each 50m, 100m, 200m & 400m events will be scheduled in the morning heats session. Remaining heats will be swum in the slower heats session.

b. The fastest heat of the 800m and 1500m freestyle will swum in the evening session (as per 4a). The slower heats will be swum in the slower heats session.

Heats will be seeded by submitted times and cyclically seeded.

Changes to the above can be made by the Event Director for the purpose of efficient running of the competition.

c) There will be:

- a. A Super Final (of Open Age)
- b. A B Final (of Open Age)
- c. A Junior Final (AQUA World Junior age group, see 1f)

d) The fastest 20 competitors from the heats irrespective of age shall be allocated places in the Super Final and B Final.

e) The next fastest 10 age-eligible competitors shall be allocated places in the Junior Final. A competitor in the Junior Final may also be a reserve for the Super Final and will be moved to the Super Final as necessary.

f) Should any spaces be available in the Junior Final once all eligible athletes have either accepted or rejected their status within the final, athletes born 2009 or after will be offered the opportunity to swim.

g) Competitors whose entries have been accepted will be expected to swim unless they have complied with the withdrawal procedures.

5. Withdrawal from Heats

a) Withdrawals must be made by the end of the Team Leader Meeting for day one swims, and by 12 noon on the day before for subsequent days.

6. Withdrawal from Finals

a) Finalists not wishing to swim shall notify the Sport Information Desk of their intention to withdraw no later than 30 minutes after the publishing of ranked finalists. The withdrawal shall be made on the official withdrawal form.

7. Call Room

a) Competitors must report to the Competition Stewards in the Call Room for heats and finals and follow their direction. It is an athlete's responsibility to report in good time for their event. Upon entry, the athlete must ensure that they report to a Steward and be registered as being present in the Call Room.

b) All competitors are required to report to the Call Room in sufficient time and be available to parade for their event. They must enter the Call Room 'race ready' and should remain in its confines until introduced to the pool deck for their race.

c) Coaches/chaperones will not be allowed in the call room area during the finals at any time, unless agreed prior by the Event Director.

8. Awards & Prize Money

a) The winner of the Super Final will receive an award in the post-race interview.

b) Prize Money will be awarded after the last event of the meet to those achieving the highest AQUA points (men and women combined) to the sum of:

- 1st – 10,000 GBP
- 2nd – 5,000 GBP
- 3rd – 2,500 GBP
- 4th – 1,500 GBP
- 5th – 1,000 GBP

In the event of a tie in AQUA points, the prize money of the two positions in question will be added together and divided by the amount of individuals tied. For example, a tie for 2nd place would mean 2nd and 3rd place prize money (4,000 + 2,500 GBP) is added together and shared - 3250 GBP each.

c) Prize Money will be issued directly to the athlete via electronic bank transfer, or as agreed between AP Race Events and the athlete.

9. Officials

a) Technical Officials shall be selected from lists approved by British Swimming.

10. Doping Control

a) Competitors taking part in the Event may be subject to random doping control.

b) Competitors are required to bring with them either a passport or other form of national identity incorporating their photograph.

11. Team Leader Meeting

a) It is a requirement for a representative from all clubs and federations with competitors entered to attend the Team Leader Meeting. This will take place at 18:00 on 24th May 2024; the location to be identified in the Confirmation Pack.

12. Image Rights

Entrants agree that their images may be recorded, stored, used and published for the sole use of promotion of the meet over AP Race Events social media channels and any approved rights-holding third party media body, of which AP Race Events Ltd gives agreement. This also extends to official photography within the venue.

13. Other

Any point not covered by these rules will be at the discretion of the Event Director and/or AQUA Referee, depending on the matter.
